People taking certain types of drugs can bruise more easily. These drugs include: non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAID), such as aspirin and ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), blood thinners such as warfarin (Coumadin), clopidogrel (Plavix), and heparin; steroids (prednisone); and some drugs used for cancer treatment. Call the doctor if the bruise is accompanied by extreme swelling and pain. Call your doctor if you are taking a bleeding medication for a medical condition and notice severe bruises. Call your doctor if you experience bruises easily or if bruises appear for no reason. Call the doctor if the bruise is painful and under a nail or nail. On the other hand, if the person fails to remember what happened, one suspects a concussion, or if there are concerns about the wound, he or she should be brought to the nearest emergency department. If there is swelling or severe pain, your doctor may get an X-ray of the area to make sure there are no broken bones. If bleeding occurs frequently and for no apparent reason, the doctor may have blood tested to seek a bleeding disorder. Avoid aspirin because aspirin slows blood from clotting and can prolong bleeding. After about 48 hours, heat in the form of a heat washcloth or a warm heating pad applied to the bruise for 10 minutes two or three times a day can increase blood flow to the trusted area, allowing the skin to reabsorb blood more quickly. It is often sold as a cream applied to the skin. Apartment cider vinegar is reported to increase blood flow to an injury, thus breaking blood clots in bruised areas. It is usually diluted with hot water and applied as a compress.epson baths salt relaxed muscles and can help reduce the pain and swelling associated with bruising. The enzyme bromelain, found in pineapple, is a natural anti-inflammatory also reported to help dissolve blood clots, and may help reduce swelling associated with bruising. It contains tannins that build up (narrow) blood vessels. Black tea or green tea sachets applied directly to bruises are reported to help reduce discoloration from bruises. The real one is known for its healing properties, and many believe it speeds up the healing of bruises. Aloe gel is usually applied directly to the skin. Doctors do not have special treatment for bruises other than the techniques described below in home remedies: ice packs and subsequent heat, over-the-counter pain medications, and elevation of the trusted area, if possible. A suspected victim of domestic abuse may be referred to a law enforcement official and/or social worker. If a bruise does not heal after three or four weeks, or if it swells or becomes more painful, it may indicate a hematoma (blood gathering under the skin).
