Miranda Hart is a British comedian, actress, and writer who rose to fame with her self-titled sitcom, which began broadcast from November 2009. The show follows her semi-autobiographical writing and features Sarah Hadland, Tom Ellis, Patricia Hodge, James Holmes, and Sally Phillips. Hart has received positive comments from critics for her performance in the series, winning the 2009 Royal Television Society award for comedy performance. She also presented a BBC spoof programme looking back over 2009 called 2009 Unwrapped with Miranda Hart. A similar show looking back over 2010 was also broadcast in December 2010. In 2014, she announced that her sitcom Miranda would come to an end after two final episodes due to air in December 2014. Hart has appeared as a guest host of Have I Got News for You and on the Graham Norton Show eight times, from 2010 to 2024. She also appeared on Room 101 along with Reggie Yates and John Craven in January 2013. As part of the 60-year Diamond Jubilee celebrations, Hart co-presented a number of segments at the Diamond Jubilee Concert in 2012. In addition to her TV work, Hart has appeared in several films, including I Want Candy, Angelos, The Infidel, and Spy. She played "harmless chatterbox" Miss Bates in the Jane Austen adaptation film Emma in 2020. Her sitcom Miranda was revived for a 10th anniversary special in 2020, described by Hart as "a party (not a new episode)". Miranda Hart has appeared in several comedy specials for the network alongside Jon Holmes. In October 2011, she attracted criticism after co-hosting The Chris Evans Breakfast Show with Holmes while Chris Evans was on holiday. The BBC issued a statement saying that Miranda Hart is one of the UK's best-loved comedians and feels it's important to bring new talent to its output. Hart has written her own theatre material for the Edinburgh Fringe, including one-woman shows like Miranda Hart – Throbs and It's All About Me. She also performed in Alecky Blythe's 2006 play Cruising at the Bush Theatre. In 2014, she embarked on her first tour with My, What I Call, Live Show, performing in arenas in the UK and Ireland. Hart has been involved in several charity projects, including Comic Relief does Fame Academy and Sport Relief. She starred as a judge on Let's Dance for Comic Relief and took part in Red Nose Day editions of Celebrity MasterChef and The One Show. She also donated a signed Miranda script to be auctioned in aid of Comic Relief. In her personal life, Hart is a Christian who was diagnosed with Lyme disease and ME/CFS after being chronically ill for three years. Her memoir, I Haven't Been Entirely Honest With You, published in October 2024, reveals more about her experiences. Miranda Hart's Television Career Spanned Over Two Decades Miranda Hart is a British comedian and actress who has been active in the entertainment industry for over two decades. Her television career began with small roles in various shows, but she gained prominence with her lead role as Miranda Midge in the BBC sitcom "Miranda" from 2010 to 2015. Hart also appeared in several other TV shows, including "Hyperdrive," "Not Going Out," and "Rush Hour." She made her film debut in 2008 with a short film called "The Everglades." With one of the participants due to be married and another dropping stone dead on the first day, they have their work cut out to go the distance.[3] The film was given a limited European release in 2007[citation needed] and had its US premiere in Boston in 2009.[citation needed] Despite being a British film with some notable names in the cast, it was not released in the UK until March 2013.[5][6] The DVD was released in 2013[7] marketed under Miranda Hart's name due to her recent fame.[1] However, Hart only makes a brief appearance, her screen time totalling 5 minutes.[3][5][6] The film received the Audience Award at the 2007 Zurich Film Festival,[8] Indie Spirit Best Storyline Award at the 2009 Boston International Film Festival[9] and the Best Film Award at the 2009 LA British Film Festival. [citation needed] The LA Campus Circle graded the film A– and called it "smart, funny and surprising without being pretentious or hackneyed. There are few dull moments, and it actually succeeds in pulling off the twists." [4] The film was also praised by The Film Review[3] and CineVue.[7] The Guardian, however, gave it a poor review.[5] as did the Radio Times[10] and the Daily Express.[11]
