AP Courses are offered in various subjects like Algebra II, Biology, Computer Science A, English Language and Composition, European History, Pre-Calculus, Psychology, Spanish Language and Culture, Statistics, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History: Modern, Chemistry, and Languages such as Spanish. Diploma Endorsements are available in CTE, Math, Science, and other areas. Boys PSAL Sports include Baseball, Basketball, Handball, Soccer, and Volleyball, while Girls PSAL Sports include Basketball, Softball, and Volleyball.
