They also help fluff the comforter and reduce the drying time.Shake and fluff the comforter after every few minutes. This will help prevent wrinkles and keep the blanket in good shape. You can hang your comforter on a clothesline or you can use a drying rack. With your comforter still in the tub, refill the tub about two-thirds of the way full and let the comforter soak for an additional 5 minutes. Gently agitate the comforter in the water as you wait for the 5 minutes to pass. [13] Agitating the comforter as it soaks ensures that you get all the soap out. 5 Drain the tub and push the water out of your comforter. Push the excess water out of the comforter with your hands, directing it down the drain until you've expelled as much as possible. [14] Don't wring out the comforter to avoid causing any damage to the fabric. 6 Hang your comforter to dry. Transfer your freshly laundered comforter to hang dry outside on a line or across a railing. Hand-drying your comforter usually takes around 1-3 hours. To properly clean and dry your UGG sherpa blanket, you should first wash it on a gentle wool cycle with cold water in a front loading machine. It is important to not use fabric softener or bleach on the blanket. Allow it to air dry after machine washing. You should then tumble dry it on low heat for about 15-20 minutes. It is important to add a few tennis balls in the dryer to help break up any clumps and make sure the sherpa fibers are evenly distributed.
