The injury was present at birth, but it was flatter and lighter in color. The physical examination revealed a discrete, oval plate, measured seven inches. The injury had a shoe model with a prominent hair growth (see accompanying figure). Based on the patient's history and physical examination, which of the following diagnoses is most likely? A. Acquisition of melanocytic nevus. B. Becker Nevus. C. Congenital melanocytic nevus. D. Melanoma. E. plexiform neurofibroma. The answer is C: congenital melanocytic nevus. Congenital melanocytic nevi are usually present at birth or appear within the first months of life. 1 The incidence varies from 1 to 2 for any size of snow melanocytic congenital to approximately one in 20000 for the snow giant. 2 Most congenital snow melanocytic nevi are intradermal or compound in nature. 3 They are classified according to the diameter of the adult age as small (less than 1.5 cm), medium or intermediate (1.5-19.9 cm) and large or giant (20 cm or Small and medium snows are generally round or oval and oval. Oval. At birth, these lesions are flat or mildly palpable and tanned, but over time they become raised and darkened. They can have a wart or cobble surface.5 Hypertrophicosis can become prominent. The congenital giant melanocytic snows can have irregular patterns and are often accompanied by smaller "satellites". Although snows are generally benign, some, especially giant ones, can be associated with the development of malignant melanoma. 1 Congenital melanocytic nevi, especially those occurring in the back stem, can rarely involve the central nervous system. The usual treatment for congenital melanocytic nevi of small and medium size is observation. 4 The decision to remove a nevus is based on the malignant potential cosmetic outcome. 4 Prophylactic excision is performed for giant congenital melanocytic snows to reduce the risk of melanoma. Other treatments include surface excision, laser treatment, curatage, chemical peeling, and dermoabrasion with regular follow-up. A conservative approach was also recommended with serial nevo photography and a close follow-up. 2 All patients with congenital melanocytic nevi must be educated on solar protection. 1.4The acquired melanocytic snows are small (less than 8 mm in diameter), well circumscribed, round or ovoid with a homogeneous surface and a uniform pigmentation. Compared to the congenital type, the acquired melanocytic snows are smaller, more uniform in architecture and morphology, and present themselves in greater number. The American College of Cardiology Cardiology (ACCF), the American Heart Association (AHA), and the Heart Rhythm Society (HRS) have issued updated guidelines for the management of atrial fibrillation. Since previous guidelines were issued in 2006, new data became available on strict and lenient heart rate monitoring, the combined use of anticoagulant and anticoagulation therapy, and the use of dronedarone (Multaq). Table 1 summarises the new and amended recommendations. Recommendations on the thrombotic agent dabigatran (Pradaxa) and the Watchman Atrial Appendage Closure Device have not been included in this update because it has not been approved for clinical use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration at the time of organizational approval of these guidelines. Parameters for optimal rate control in patients with atrial fibrillation are controversial, and there is no standard method to evaluate heart rate control to guide treatment. Generally accepted criteria for rate control include a ventricular rate between 60 and 80 beats per minute at rest and between 90 and 115 beats per minute during moderate exercise. The definition of appropriate rate control relies primarily on short-term haemodynamic benefits. This definition has not been well studied with respect to quality of life, symptoms, development of cardiomyopathy, and ventricular response to atrial fibrillation. Data showed no clinically relevant differences in outcomes between the control of strict rates (less than 80 beats per minute at rest and less than 110 beats per minute during moderate exercise) and the control of lenient rates (less than 110 beats per minute at rest). Control of the lenient rate requires fewer visits and outpatient examinations, and is generally more convenient for patients. As it has not been shown below the control Strict speed, lenient speed control is a reasonable strategy in patients with permanent atrial fibrillation. The data also showed no benefit of rhythm control compared to rate control in patients with fibrillation and systolic heart failure. Studies have shown that oral anticoagulation therapy with warfarin (Coumadin) is superior to the combination of aspirin and the anti-platelet agent clopidogrel (Plavix) to prevent vascular events in patients with atrial fibrillation. Treatment with clopidogrel and aspirin has been associated with a risk of bleeding similar to that with warfarin. In patients with atrial fibrillation who are not suitable candidates for warfarin therapy, treatment with clopidogrel and aspirin has been shown to reduce the risk of major vascular events, especially stroke, compared to patients taking more placebo aspirin. However, the combination of aspirin and clopidogrel also increased the risk of increased bleeding. The use of clopidogrel and aspirin plus warfarin (i. e. triple therapy) has been proposed for the treatment and prevention of complications of two or more co-existing conditions (e. g., atrial fibrillation, valve mechanical prosthesis, presence of drug cleansing stent). This combination is associated with an increased risk of bleeding complications, and randomized tests of this strategy have not been reported. Dronedaron, which is similar to amiodarone, has been shown to reduce hospitalisation for cardiovascular problems in patients with paroxysmic or persistent atrial fibrillation or atrial flutter and risk factors for thromboembolism. The recommended oral dose of dronedaron is 400 mg twice a day with meals. The main adverse reactions include bradycardia and QT prolongation. Dronedaron has also shown an increase in mortality in patients with a recent episode of decompensated heart failure and depressed left ventricular function.
